## School Lunch Changes

The Nova Scotia School Lunch Program is making targeted changes to improve meal quality, reduce waste and better match how lunches are prepared and delivered. New lunches coming to all schools include pork and vegetarian egg roll bowls, chicken fingers and a gluten-friendly cornbread that can replace other bread options.

To help ensure consistent quality, menus are being tailored to whether lunches are prepared on-site or delivered to schools.

For schools with lunch delivery, meals that transport well, like barbecued chicken drumsticks and glazed meatloaf, will be added. Some existing meals have also been adjusted to have sides that transport better, like whole apples and oranges. New menu items in schools where lunches are made on-site include grilled cheese with tomato soup, and pork quesadillas.

The Province is partnering with Canadian company Friendlier to pilot reusable containers in 34 schools that serve about 26,000 lunches a week. The program will start at the end of February.

The company, with partners in more than 200 locations across Canada, will supply clean containers for lunches and collect used containers for professional cleaning. Containers can be reused up to 100 times and are recycled by Friendlier at the end of their lifecycle.

## NS Power Supports

### West Dalhousie Hall

On January 13 Nova Scotia Power presented West Dalhousie Community Hall with a \$15,000 donation toward the Hall's solar panel installation project.

During and after this summer's wildfire, Nova Scotia Power was deeply involved in efforts in the community. NS Power disconnected power when required, replaced damaged poles and lines, restored service as quickly as conditions allowed, and ensured electrical safety throughout the recovery process.

The posting from the Hall says, "This donation will contribute towards the installation of solar panels at the community hall, helping reduce operating costs, improve energy reliability during power outages, and strengthen the long term sustainability of this important community space. Investing in renewable energy will help ensure the hall can continue to serve residents of West Dalhousie and surrounding communities for years to come."

Applications for the Wildfire Community Preparedness Day open Nov. 1, 2025 and close Jan. 31, 2026. Wildfire Community Preparedness Day is a national campaign that encourages citizens to take actions that increase their home, neighbourhood and community's resilience to wildfire.

Wildfire Community Preparedness Day is always observed on the first Saturday in May. In 2026, it will take place on Saturday, May 2. Residents of all ages all over the country are encouraged to come together at any time from May to October to host events and work on projects that raise awareness of wildfire risk and increase their resilience to it.

Groups can also apply for a \$500 award to fund their Prep Day events. FireSmart™ Canada, in collaboration with the Institute for Catastrophic Loss Reduction (ICLR), Co-operators and the Provincial and Territorial wildfire agencies supports this annual event by offering the \$500 award. 



## Our Communities Aren't Broken — They're Waiting for Us

Most people care deeply about their community.

They care about their neighbours. About places where people gather. About feeling connected, useful, and part of something that matters. They worry about loneliness, mental health, and the sense that community life doesn't feel the way it used to.

At the same time, many local organizations are quietly struggling. Community halls, churches, service clubs, charities, and volunteer groups across our region are increasingly run by the same small group of people. These volunteers show up year after year — organizing events, opening buildings, managing details, solving problems — because they believe in what these places provide.

They do it gladly. Until they are simply exhausted.

This is not because others don't care. It's because many people feel stretched thin, overwhelmed, and unsure where they still fit. Life feels full. Days are busy. Evenings disappear quickly. We tell ourselves we'll get involved when things slow down — when we have more time, more energy, fewer responsibilities.

And yet, many of us feel lonely. We miss real connection. We miss being known. We wonder why it feels harder than it once did to build friendships or feel rooted where we live.

What we may have forgotten is that, for generations, belonging wasn't something people waited to feel — it was something they practiced.

Community involvement wasn't reserved for a few "volunteer types." It was simply part of life. You joined the committee. You helped with the supper. You coached, baked, cleaned, organized, or showed up when needed. Whatever you were good at or enjoyed, you found a way to share it with your community.

Not because it was glamorous, but because that was how community worked. Through shared effort, people formed bonds. They felt needed. Life felt fuller.

Today, many of the people still doing this work do so quietly and without recognition. When things run smoothly, their effort goes unseen. When something struggles, they are more likely to hear criticism than offers of help. Over time, even the most committed volunteers burn out.

When they step back, something precious falters — not just an organization, but a shared place for connection.

This matters because we are also living through a loneliness and mental-health crisis. We are searching for purpose and meaning, often in isolation. We talk about self-care, but we frequently overlook one of the strongest sources of well-being: being part of something real, local, and shared.

The truth is, most people don't need to do more. They need to belong again. Community does not require perfection or endless availability. It doesn't demand everything you have. Often, it asks for something small — an hour, a skill, a willingness to help, or simply showing up.

When more people step into that space, the load lightens for everyone. Organizations stabilize. Long-time volunteers feel supported. New energy and leadership emerge. And individuals rediscover a quiet sense of purpose that no amount of scrolling can replace.

Our communities are not failing. They are waiting. Waiting for people to remember that community is not something we consume from a distance. It is something we build — together.

And the invitation is still open.

## Primary and Pre-Primary Registration

From January to May, schools invite families in our region to register children who will be eligible for Primary or Pre-Primary in the next school year. Families are encouraged to register as early as possible during the January to May Preprimary/Primary registration period, both to help with planning for the new school year and to ensure children have opportunities to join orientation events.

To register for Pre-Primary, a child must be at least four years old by December 31 of the year they enter the program.

To register for Primary, a child must be at least five years old by December 31 of the year they start school. <https://avrce.ca/registration>

## 9-8-8 Crisis Line Support

The federal government will invest up to \$120.2 million over the next two years to support the continued operations of the 9-8-8: Suicide Crisis Helpline, Canada's national, three-digit number for suicide crisis support.

The 9-8-8 network includes 37 partners across Canada who work with the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health (CAMH) in delivering crisis support from trained responders. Partners include local crisis lines, provincial mental health services, and national organizations such as Kids Help Phone and Hope for Wellness.

- Every day in Canada, 13 people die by suicide on average, and more than 250 people attempt it.
- In 2023, the Government of Canada announced an investment of \$177 million over three years to CAMH for the implementation and operation of 9-8-8 and to bolster the capacity of distress centres that were part of the existing network.
- Since its launch in November 2023, 9-8-8 answered more than 800,000 calls and texts.
- **At any time, anyone across the country who is experiencing a suicide crisis can call or text 9-8-8** to access bilingual, trauma-informed, and culturally appropriate suicide prevention support. The service is available 24/7/365 and is also a resource for those worried about someone close to them.

Every month that there are 5 Sundays we meet with other independent Baptist churches for fellowship, food, fun and spiritual instruction.


There are so many things planned for all age groups ranging from the little fella that is 1 to the old fella that is 80.



## West Dalhousie Wildfire After Action Report

At the COTW meeting January 13, Annapolis County municipal staff presented council with a report on the municipal response to last summer's destructive Long Lake / West Dalhousie wildfire. The report's purpose is to provide a critical analysis of the response from the municipality's perspective and does not review the actions of the fire departments that battled the blaze.

The wildfire that grew to nearly 8,500 hectares in size, destroyed 20 homes and forced hundreds of people to flee in the West Dalhousie area in August.

"It gives us an opportunity to take a step back and look at what went well and what we would try and improve on, you know, if we ever had the unfortunate incident of being in that situation again," Chief Administration Officer Rob Frost, who compiled the report, told CBC News.

The report characterizes the county response as "very good" overall but saw communication between agencies and staff burnout as areas for improvement. Comments and feedback from affected residents will be added later. 



## NS Auditor Releases Report

**Nova Scotia's annual spending has grown steadily since 2020-21 and is now \$18 billion annually, up \$5.4 billion and 43 per cent, Auditor General Kim Adair says in her 2025 Financial Report.**

Nova Scotia's net debt is also growing. Even with a history of recent surpluses including the audited \$265 million surplus, **the Province's net debt is up \$1.7 billion from the previous year and was \$20.8 billion at the end of fiscal 2024-25.**

"A trend of increased net debt weakens a government's financial position because more of its future revenues will be needed to pay its past debts. That could negatively impact the ability to provide provincial services without resorting to additional borrowing," Adair says.

Key to the \$1.7 billion increase in the year's net debt were the capital investments in various health facility projects, including \$361 million in the Halifax Infirmary Expansion and \$146 million for Cape Breton Healthcare Redevelopment. There was also an investment of \$325 million for the province's long-term care facilities including nursing homes.

Service agreements with the nursing home operators, worth \$15.7 billion at the end of 2024-25, are one of the major contributors to an increase in Nova Scotia's contractual obligations, also known as spending commitments. Over the past five years, Nova Scotia's total future spending commitments have continued to increase, growing from \$9.8 billion in 2020-21 to \$29.7 billion in 2024-25.

Nova Scotia's unmatured debt, which now stands at \$19.3 billion, is also increasing. Paying down debt will take up a significant portion of the province's revenues in both the short and long term.

**The interest on debt for 2024-25 was \$756 million; an increase of \$207 million from the five-year low of \$549 million in 2021-22.** Those debt servicing costs currently stand at \$810 per Nova Scotian, the highest of the past five years.

The Auditor General continues to caution that significant uncertainty has impacted the Province's revenue estimates.

"Total revenue has exceeded the budgeted amount for four of the past five years by \$5.8 billion and the Province appears to have used the increased revenue to advance additional spending."

The Auditor General has been highlighting additional appropriation spending in the annual Financial Report since 2022.

Over the last five years, the Province has spent \$6.7 billion in this over-budget spending, with \$1.6 billion in 2024-25 alone.

"Although I noted accountability and transparency around over-budget spending improved slightly this year, I am concerned that important recommendations remain unaddressed," said Adair.

The Annual Financial Report has two chapters and provides insights into topics of interest impacting the Province including:

**Healthcare Costs Up Over Five Years:** Nova Scotia's annual healthcare operating expenses were \$7.7 billion in 2024-25, an increase of \$2.4 billion over the last five years

**Tobacco Settlement:** The Province may receive up to \$784.8 million over 20 years from Canadian tobacco companies to help offset costs of smoking on the healthcare system

**The Province Purchased \$117 Million of Receivables from Nova Scotia Power:** To ease rising electricity rates and prevent a significant rate increase for customers, the Province spent \$117 million to purchase receivables from the utility

**Impact of Removing Bridge Tolls:** Annual toll revenue of roughly \$25-37 million is no longer being collected; Province is now responsible for future capital and operating expenses for both Halifax Harbour bridges, which averaged \$29 million a year for the past five years

**Government Received a Clean Audit Opinion on its Financial Statements:** The Government provided reliable financial information for 2024-25 within the legislated deadline. For the 25th year in a row, the Province of Nova Scotia received a clean audit opinion. That audit opinion means that the decision makers in Government, and all Nova Scotians, have assurance that they can rely on the financial statements.

While the financial statements are reliable and many processes work well, underlying significant control weaknesses at two Government departments and two Government organizations need to be fixed. Significant control weaknesses increase the risk of unreliable financial reporting and misuse of assets in the future.

About the recipients and their acts of bravery:

On January 11, 2025, Gerrid Hunt was alerted by his daughter that their neighbour's home was on fire. When Mr. Hunt learned that a man and three children were still inside, he entered the smoke-filled home on his hands and knees, feeling around until he found an unconscious man who he was able to drag to safety. The man, his wife and a young child survived; tragically, three other children did not. The Hunt family also lost their home in the blaze.

On February 14, 2025, Richard MacPhee, Ryan O'Shea and Scott Rafuse learned that two fellow snowmobilers had not returned from a trip in the Cape Breton Highlands. With conditions deteriorating and knowing the trails, they decided to search that evening. They found one of the men after a difficult search and assisted him until he was able to get to safety. They later joined the major search-and-rescue operation that was underway and helped find the other man.

## What's happening NOW in the woods

On November 30th, Save Our Old Forests president, Nina Newington set up Camp NOW on the side of a logging road in the proposed Goldsmith Lake Wilderness Area. NOW stands for Need Our Wilderness. She and others had recently found fresh flagging on the peninsula between Corbett and Dalhousie Lakes, indicating that WestFor intended to go ahead with logging this part of the proposed wilderness area. Camp NOW is protesting the government's failure to protect Goldsmith, and, more generally, the minuscule progress the government has made in meeting their legal commitment to protect 20% of our lands and waters by 2030.

Coincidentally, a few days later, DNR made public their plans to clearcut 31 hectares inside the proposed Goldsmith Lake Wilderness Area. That was jolting enough. But it wasn't just this area. Clearcut plans were announced for many of the other wilderness areas citizens have proposed for protection, including 79 ha in the expansion proposed for the Lamb's Lake Nature Reserve next to Mickey Hill Provincial Park.

Worse still, the plans go beyond clearcutting. DNR wants to establish these sites as permanent High Production Forestry sites – industrial tree farms sprayed with glyphosate to kill off the hardwoods that naturally regrow in Nova Scotia after clearcutting. The intent is to create pure softwood stands all the same age that will be clearcut again in 30-50 years. Rinse and repeat. Supposing our climate doesn't heat up too much for these cold-loving species. This type of managed forest is the least biodiverse, most fire-prone type of forest there is.

Biodiversity simply means the variety of life. Old-growth natural forests support the greatest variety of life because they have been forests for a very long time. During that time, they have developed structural complexity, aka lots of nooks and crannies. Their complexity makes them more diverse and more resilient. The loss of this complexity of life, thanks to the replacement of old forests with young ones (forest degradation) as well as deforestation (more of an issue in other parts of the world), will lead to the collapse of crucial ecosystems, the natural systems we depend on for clean water and air to breathe. Biodiversity loss compounds the dangers of climate breakdown. That's why, in 2023 in Montreal, the countries of the world agreed to protect 30% of their lands and waters by 2030. Protecting biodiversity is not a 'nice to have', it is essential if we want a livable planet.

DNR itself recognizes that High Production Forestry destroys biodiversity. They are supposed to have screened all the potential sites identified for this type of forestry on Crown land and dropped any with high biodiversity. But DNR has an abysmal track record for identifying key indicators of biodiversity value. When some of us hiked in to check out the Goldsmith site DNR wants to clearcut, we found 3 endangered Black Ash trees and 13 Species at Risk lichens as well as huge old pine trees. All that close to streams and a river where the endangered Bay of Fundy Atlantic Salmon have been documented. Our discoveries come as no big surprise. In the proposed Goldsmith Lake Wilderness Area as a whole, we have identified 63 Species at Risk occurrences affecting cutblocks DNR approved for logging. DNR found none.


The main Species at Risk we have found in an extraordinary concentration at Goldsmith, the Frosted Glass Whiskers lichen, takes a very long time to establish – think 100 years. In other words, it requires old forest, the sort of forest that also supports many, many other lifeforms. The places where you find it should be protected, not just to save this lichen but because these places are likely to support many other forms of life too.

So why is DNR proposing the most destructive form of forestry there is for areas citizens have identified as being ecologically valuable enough to be worth protecting? The Goldsmith area certainly meets all the criteria outlined in the 'Collaborative Protected Areas Strategy: An Action Plan for Achieving 20%.' The province published that strategy just over two years ago. What has changed? Is the forestry industry so short of wood that we can't do our modest bit towards meeting that global target of protecting 30% by 2030?

Well no. This Monday morning on CBC, Todd Burgess, head of Forest Nova Scotia, the forestry industry's mouthpiece, said there was no shortage of wood in Nova Scotia. He saw no reason we could not manage both conservation and forestry. Government affirms that they are still committed to protecting 20%. But they are doing less than nothing to meet their own goal.

Last April it looked as if we were making progress in getting the Goldsmith Lake Wilderness Area formally protected. MLA David Bowlby sent out a letter to constituents who'd been asking for his help with this. The letter indicated that the area was being formally evaluated for protection. That was exciting news. Formal evaluation is part of the established process by which an area is given permanent protection. But then the spokesperson for the PC caucus announced that MLA Bowlby had made a mistake. The area was not being formally evaluated after all.

The obvious question is, why not? In the wake of the discovery that DNR is planning to turn parts of both the Goldsmith Lake and the Lamb's Lake/Mickey Hill proposed protected areas into High Production Forestry clearcut and spray sites, a lot of constituents will be asking MLA Bowlby that question.
