## Public Health Measles Vaccination Clinics

With March break coming soon and winter travel picking up, Public Health is offering enhanced access to measles vaccination for those who are eligible in Western Zone. Nova Scotians are reminded that measles is still circulating at high levels across Canada and around the world. It is important to ensure families are up-to-date on their vaccinations at least 14 days prior to travel to be protected, and that two doses (4 weeks apart) are required to be fully immunized.

The following clinics will offer Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR) and Measles, Mumps, Rubella, Varicella (MMRV) vaccines for free to those who are eligible:

Please bring your health card with you, if you have one. Immunization clinics are healthcare environments. Masks are required and will be offered upon entry to the clinic. Clinics may be cancelled due to inclement weather.

### Why get vaccinated?

Public Health encourages everyone to make sure your routine vaccines are up to date, including vaccines protecting against measles. During this season of increased travel, chances of being exposed to illnesses like measles are higher. Staying protected helps keep your family and community safe, whether you are traveling or staying close to home.

### Who can get vaccinated?

Infants (6 to 11 months): If planning to travel, 1 dose of MMR vaccine may be given. The child will still need two routine doses after their first birthday.

Children and Youth (1 to 17 years): 2 doses of MMRV are normally given at 12 and 18 months. Older children and youth are eligible for 2 catch-up doses if childhood vaccines were missed.

Adults (18 to 55 years, born in 1970 or later): Adults born between 1970 and 1995 were offered only 1 dose as children and another dose is recommended. Adults born in 1996 or later were offered 2 doses as children. If 2 doses were received, they are fully vaccinated. Adults are eligible for up to 2 catch-up doses if childhood vaccines were missed.

Older Adults (55+ years, born in 1969 or earlier): Older adults are generally considered immune, but can get a single dose if travelling.

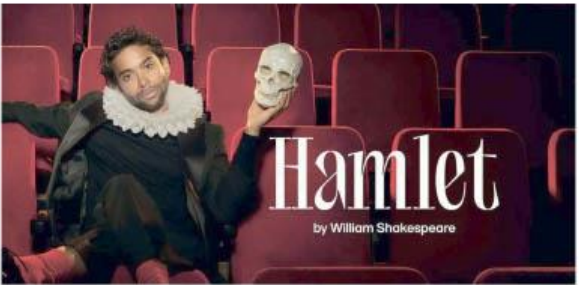

ACTS at Work on the Trail

The Annapolis County Trails Society (ACTS) is entering the new year with a mostly new board of directors and plenty of enthusiasm about the Harvest Moon Trailway, which runs 110 km from Grand Pre to Annapolis Royal. ACTS administers the western half of the trail (roughly 55 km ) with the guidance of Nova Scotia Department of Natural Resources, which owns the land where the Dominion Atlantic Railway once ran.

ACTS is a volunteer-led, not-for-profit society responsible for the operation and maintenance of the multi-use trail. It operates in conjunction with the Annapolis Valley Trails Coalition, Trans Canada Trail, and the three municipalities within Annapolis County.

Trail users have seen major upgrades in recent years, including a wider trail bed, improved drainage, and new bridges at all stream crossings. Federal funding through Public Safety Canada’s Disaster Assistance Financial Arrangements has strengthened bridges to better withstand flooding and allow emergency vehicle access.

ACTS will continue improvements on the trail by installing benches, adding signage, and better managing our natural features, such as trees and shrubs.

ACTS will hold its first official board meeting on February 19. Although initially announced as open to the public, this first meeting is closed, as board members must first address transition and housekeeping matters. The public will be invited to a future meeting and is welcome to share input in the meantime by emailing [an.co.tr.so.2025@gmail.com](mailto:an.co.tr.so.2025@gmail.com). New Programs Support Local Beef

New funding for Nova Scotia cattle producers and processors will increase local beef processing and help producers manage their production costs.

New programs under the Nova Scotia Beef Initiative include:

- Nova Scotia Beef Finishing Equipment Support Program – funding for tools and equipment that help producers give their cattle the optimal rations for converting feed into weight gain as they prepare the cattle for market; the upgrades will help producers manage rising costs due to inflation and climate change and should increase the supply of local beef in the province
- Nova Scotia Beef Processing Program – funding for new and current abattoir owners for infrastructure and equipment to increase beef processing, including major upgrades to existing operations.

The programs will be administered by Perennia.

NS First-time Homebuyers Program

A new program launched today, February 3, will seek to make it easier for Nova Scotians to become homeowners, faster.

Through the First-time Homebuyers Program, the required down payment is two per cent of the purchase price, which is less than half the usual minimum down payment. The Province of Nova Scotia is partnering with Atlantic Central and credit unions across Nova Scotia to deliver this pilot program as a way to help Nova Scotians overcome one of the barriers to buying a home.

To qualify for the program, the borrower must be a resident of Nova Scotia and also meet the following criteria:

- have a household income of \$200,000 or less
- pass the Canada Mortgage and Housing Corp. stress test to determine the maximum mortgage they can carry
- have a credit score of 630 or higher
- be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident or an immigrant with an endorsement certificate from the Nova Scotia provincial immigration program.

Previous homeowners who have not owned a home in the last four years may also be eligible.

There is a cap on the price of homes for buyers in the program – \$570,000 in Halifax Regional Municipality and the Municipality of East Hants and \$500,000 in the rest of the province.

Nova Scotians interested in obtaining a mortgage through the First-time Homebuyers Program should contact their local participating credit union. More information on the program, including a list of participating credit unions, can be found at: <https://novascotia.ca/first-time-homebuyers-program-pilot>

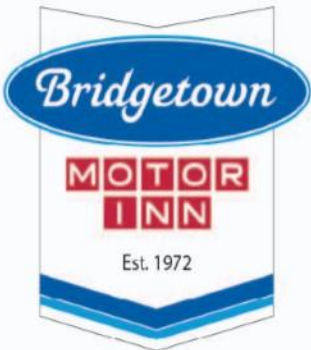
The Province is acting as a guarantor for mortgages through the program. If a buyer defaults and the lender ends up reselling the home at a price lower than the outstanding mortgage, the Province will cover 90 per cent of the shortfall.

- Quick Facts:
- the minimum down payment on homes up to \$500,000 is typically five per cent; for homes costing up to \$570,000, it would be five per cent on the first \$500,000 and 10 per cent on the remainder
  - Atlantic Central is the trade association for member credit unions in Atlantic Canada; the organization was selected through a competitive process to administer the pilot program
  - household partners can apply together provided they have lived together for at least 12 months or are newlyweds
  - borrowers will not be required to obtain separate mortgage insurance, which is typically required for mortgages with less than a 20 per cent down payment
  - interest rates will be capped at prime plus two per cent

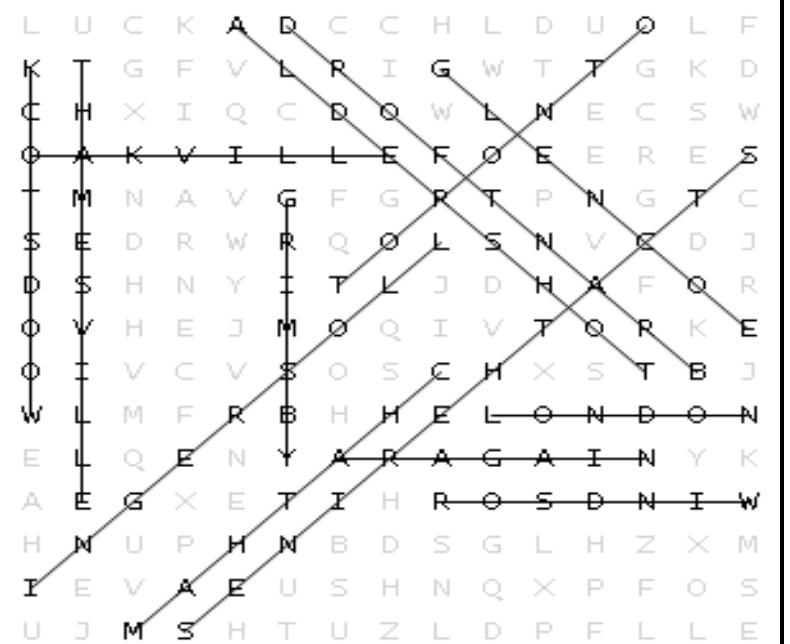
