Free Online AI Literacy Course

Acadia University has opened up an AI literacy course to public for free. The course aims to help anyone with interest in using AI tools make informed decisions

The self-paced training module, originally developed for students at the Wolfville school, is available to the public through Open Acadia, the university's online course portal.

The introductory course aims to guide students through the text-based artificial intelligence tools, such as ChatGPT and Claude, and the differences between human thinking and AI processes so they can make informed decisions about whether and how to use the technology for specific needs.

It takes about 2½ hours for participants to finish the module and earn a certificate of completion.

A lecture by Daniel Lametti, a psychologist and psycholinguist with Acadia University, is included in the course. The course will be updated to reflect changes in the technology. Register at <https://explore.acadiau.ca/product?catalog=AI-Literacy>

February is Heart Month

The month of February is a time to focus on heart health and the actions that can help save lives. Nova Scotia Health is sharing information about the EHS AED Registry, delivered by Nova Scotia Emergency Health Services. The registry helps identify where Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) are located across Nova Scotia, an important tool during a cardiac emergency.

A newer addition to the registry is the use of GoodSAM technology, which can help alert nearby trained responders and point them to registered AEDs while emergency services are on the way. Learn more:

Nova Scotia Quality of Life Survey

Engage Nova Scotia, in collaboration with the Canadian Index of Wellbeing, is excited to launch the Nova Scotia Quality of Life Survey. Sat. Feb. 21, 11:00am. The Southwest Nova Biosphere Region (SNBR) and Middleton Recreation are partnering to bring the Snowshoe Bioblitz to the Riverside Park. This family-friendly event invites community members to learn about biodiversity in Southwestern Nova Scotia using the iNaturalist app.

Meet at the trailhead by the parking lot at 11:00am. We will explore the trail and photograph as many winter plants as we can see. A prize will be available for the attendee with the highest number of species uploaded to iNaturalist at the end of the walk. This data will be incorporated into the “Best Buds Bioblitz” on iNaturalist. For more information on the bioblitz, check out the beginners’ guide on at <https://www.facebook.com/UNESCO.SNBR> Middleton recreation offers free equipment rentals including cross country skis, walking poles, and snowshoes. Attendees are encouraged to reach out to mpal@town.middleton.ns.ca to reserve snowshoes for Saturday morning.

Middleton’s “more green time, less screen time” initiative wants to see community members enjoying the great outdoors. Let’s use our screens to get outside and enjoy nature by learning plant identification with the iNaturalist app. To participate, you should have the app downloaded before you arrive. Make sure to dress warm and have your equipment ready for 11:00am.

If the weather makes the trail unsafe for the walk, we will reschedule for 11:00am on Sun. Feb. 22. If there is insufficient snow, we will enjoy a regular walk.

Best Buds Bioblitz

Did you know that iNaturalist experiences a steep decline in usage during the winter months?

Citizen science is an incredible tool to collect massive quantities of data worldwide. One of the greatest citizen science platforms is iNaturalist. This easy-to-use app allows users to upload images of living things and receive identifications from experienced naturalists to better inform us on the world’s biodiversity. But this data is not free from bias. Observations are skewed towards when people like to get outdoors, what interests them, and what is easy to photograph. Therefore, it’s easy to see why less data would be available when the great outdoors gets chilly.

The Southwest Nova Biosphere Region Association want to challenge iNaturalist users to enjoy what the wintertime wilderness has to offer in the “Best Buds Bioblitz”. Winter plant identification can be tricky, as leaf shape is usually not available as an identification tool. Learn to take high-quality observations of trees and shrubs by photographing other traits such as the buds, bark, and body shape of the plants you see this winter. All plant observations uploaded to iNaturalist within the Southwest Nova Biosphere between January 7th and March 4th will be included in the Bioblitz. So get outside with your best buds and help us fill the data gap of winter plant observations in the UNESCO-designated Southwest Nova Biosphere Region.

Bioblitz for Beginners Guide

HOW TO TAKE PART IN THE SOUTHWEST NOVA BIOSPHERE “BEST BUDS BIOBLITZ” ON INATURALIST

WHAT IS A BIOBLITZ?

A bioblitz is an event that aims to observe as many species as possible. Some may be more particular such as an insect bioblitz or a reptile bioblitz. The “Best Buds Bioblitz” is looking for observations of plants in the winter months. A bioblitz may be looking for data from a contained geographic area, such as a country or park. The “Best Buds BioBlitz” takes place in the Southwest Nova Biosphere, including the counties of Annapolis, Digby, Yarmouth, Shelburne, and Queens.



WHAT IS INATURALIST?

iNaturalist is an app that gathers pictures and audio recording of living things worldwide. This data can be used by researchers to inform us about the world biodiversity. Anyone can submit observations to iNaturalist. Naturalists can see your observations and suggest what species you might have photographed.

STEP 1

Download the iNaturalist app on your mobile device. Look for the green bird icon in the appstore. You will need to make an account to use the app.



STEP 2

Explore the different features of the app. To make an observation, click the camera icon at the bottom of your screen.



STEP 3

To take a high quality observation of a stationary living thing, there are some details you should try to include. Take a picture of the general body shape by stepping back. Then, get some closer details such as the stem/trunk, the arrangement of the branches, and the buds!




STEP 4

Write additional details in the notes section. Did you find this plant in a wetland? Was a deer feeding on its twigs? Include the location by using the pin icon. You can also include the date with the calendar icon.



STEP 5

Identify! If you know what species you are observing than make sure to include it in the “What did you see” section, indicated by a question mark. If you only have a general idea, then use a more general identification, such as “flowering plants” or “conifers”. Other users can narrow down what you observed.



STEP 6

Submit! Now you are a citizen scientist and your data can be used to help researchers worldwide! If you are interested in the other submissions to the “Best Buds Bioblitz”, then look for it in the search bar, indicated by the magnifying glass. All iNaturalist observations of plants in the Biosphere will automatically be included in the bioblitz.





Protect Yourself from Online Fraud

According to the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre, as of September 30, 2025, they've processed 33,854 fraud reports, identified 23,113 victims, and recorded \$544 million in losses.

Scammers are using every digital tool. Staying skeptical online is one of the best ways to protect yourself. Stay ahead of the latest scams and learn how to protect yourself, visit the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre: <https://antifraudcentre-centreantifraude.ca/>

For instance, The Antifraud Centre provides this information about financial scams and warning signs and tips.

How it works

Fraudsters are impersonating financial institutions, law enforcement, Amazon and credit reporting agencies claiming that your bank account has been compromised.

You get an automated phone call claiming to be your financial institution, law enforcement, credit reporting agency or, in some cases, Amazon advising that there have been fraudulent transactions in your account. Fraudsters will request access to your computer or device to continue the "investigation". You are then shown a fraudulent transaction on their online bank account. The suspects tell you that they want your help in an ongoing "investigation" against the criminals who stole your money and ask you send funds as part of the "investigation".

In some cases, fraudsters will add you as a "payee" with a fraudulent email address and tell you that you have to transfer a large amount of money to protect your account. The fraudsters will convince you that they have added funds to your account but, in reality, they took the money from your line of credit or savings account.

Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA) code
Suspects may have your debit card number and password but cannot access your account because you have multi-factor authentication protection on your account. Suspects will contact you claiming to be your financial institution and say that you must provide them with the code you get by text message or email in order to confirm your identity. This code is the multi-factor authentication code which gives the suspects full access to your bank account.

Residence visits

Suspects will tell you that they need to get your debit or credit card from your home as part of the investigation. They will come to your home to pick up the card and they may even you to cut the card in half without damaging the card chip to make it seem more legitimate. They may also threaten that you may be arrested if you do not cooperate.

Warning signs and how to protect yourself

- * Criminals use Call-Spoofing to mislead victims. Do not assume that phone numbers appearing on your call display are accurate
- * If you get an incoming call claiming to be from your financial institution, advise the caller that you will call them back. End the call and dial the number on the back of your bank debit card from a different phone if possible or wait 10 minutes before making the outgoing call
- * Credit bureaus will not randomly call you, unless it is a requested call back. If you receive an incoming call claiming to be from a credit bureau, advise the caller that you will call them back. Visit the credit bureau's website and contact the official phone number provided
- * These institutions or law enforcement will never threaten you over the phone
- * Don't share codes received via text message or email with anyone. In most cases, these are multi-factor authentication codes that will give fraudsters access to your account

* Fraudsters will often provide the first 4 to 6 numbers of your debit or credit card. Remember that these numbers are used to identify the card issuer and are known as the Bank Identifier Number (BIN). Most debit and credit card numbers issued by specific financial institutions begin with the same 4 to 6 numbers

* If your personal information has been compromised in the past through a breach or a phishing message, remember that the information can be used as a tool to make the communication appear legitimate

- * Never provide remote access to your computer
- * Institutions or online merchants will never request transferring funds to an external account for security reasons
- * Institutions or police will never request you to turn over your bank card nor attend your residence to pick up your bank card
- * Enabling Auto-Deposits for Interac e-transfers provides an additional layer of security

In November 2025, the RCMP launched a **National Cybercrime and Fraud Reporting System**, a new national system for individuals, businesses and organizations to report incidents of fraud and cybercrime. It is estimated that only 5 to 10% of all fraud and cybercrime incidents are currently reported. The website is <https://reportcyberandfraud.canada.ca/>
