Annapolis Heritage Society Reacts to Funding Cuts

Last week, the Provincial Budget 2026-27 was formally announced, revealing devastating cuts within the Department of Communities, Culture, Tourism, and Heritage. It was at this time that the Annapolis Heritage Society learned of the decision to **permanently close 12 museum sites across Nova Scotia, including our own North Hills Museum**, a treasured heritage site with deep roots in our community.

Since 1764, North Hills has stood overlooking the Annapolis Basin, an enduring testament to those who not only shaped the home itself but also shaped the history of our region. The home was saved from dilapidation in the early 1960s by Robert Patterson, an antique collector and staunch supporter of local built heritage. At Mr. Patterson's bequest, North Hills became a member of the Nova Scotia Museum family in 1974. Since then, AHS has worked in partnership with the Nova Scotia Museum to preserve and promote the property and its extensive collection. We have taken immense pride and care in the interpretation of the stories connected with North Hills, from architecture and antiques to domestic and rural life. In recent years, dedicated staff and volunteers have worked hard to bring the museum to life through new seasonal events, renewed interpretive programming, and creative outreach initiatives. We are incredibly disappointed that this progress will be lost.

Being a provincial site, North Hills Museum represented a valuable investment in our rural community. The operating funding for North Hills allowed us to support the local economy through seasonal employment, maintenance contracts, and sourcing supplies locally. North Hills Museum is also a beloved space for members of our community to gather, share stories, and learn together. North Hills, like all museums, is not just a building. It is an important piece of our past and an active player in our present community. Its closure not only erases history but destroys any potential for future growth.

In addition to the closure of North Hills Museum, there has also been a 20% decrease in operating grants for the O'Dell House and Sinclair Inn Museums. These drastic



cuts have created an unexpected and unprecedented challenge for our organization as we continue to uphold our purpose of preserving local heritage by making it accessible in ways that will inspire curiosity about the people, places, and events that shape us.

At this time, we do not yet know the full impact these cuts will have on our operations, but we know that community support is needed now more than ever. We wish to express our sincere thanks to those who have been advocating for heritage across the province and within our own community and to those who have reached out directly to offer support. If you have not done so already, we encourage you to contact your representatives to express your concern about the devastating and widespread impacts of these budget cuts.





Competition for NS Power

Nova Scotians will soon have the option of bypassing the province's monopoly utility for electricity, with the development of an onshore wind farm expected to start operations late this year. The Mersey River Wind project, which just launched, will comprise 33 onshore turbines located about 150 kilometres southwest of Halifax, generating 150 megawatts, enough to power 50,000 homes.

It also represents the transformation of the market. Customers have the opportunity to buy contracts from Nova Scotia-based Renewall Energy Inc., which first applied for its retail licence more than four years ago. Currently, Nova Scotia residents, and commercial and industrial customers get their electricity from Nova Scotia Power, a unit of Emera Inc., the regulated utility that supplies virtually the whole province. Military Housing Expansion in Greenwood

On Feb. 27, the Honourable Kody Blois, Parliamentary Secretary to the Prime Minister and Member of Parliament for Kings-Hants and Chris d'Entremont, Member of Parliament for Acadie-Annapolis visited Canadian Forces Base (CFB) Greenwood to announce a military housing expansion that will bring approximately 200 new Residential Housing Units (RHUs) to the area. These new builds will feature primarily one- and two-bedroom unit apartments. While construction will take place within the existing residential housing area, the exact locations will be determined following the completion of site studies.

This initiative builds on the progress of the first phase of the construction program, which is well underway. CFB Greenwood was prioritized as one of the nine locations facing the most acute housing pressures. Phase 1 is currently adding 48 new RHUs to the current portfolio and this announcement significantly expands on that progress.

Through this expansion, the Government of Canada is not only increasing housing capacity but also reinforcing its commitment to military members and their families. This investment strengthens the Canadian Armed Forces' (CAF) ability to recruit and retain its members by improving access to safe and modern housing and supporting local economies through construction activity in communities across the country. Modern, energy-efficient residential housing enables operational readiness, enhances quality of life for CAF members and reduces pressure on local housing markets in surrounding communities.







Budget Defunds Nova Scotia Books, Authors, Publishers, Booksellers

The Department of Communities, Culture, Tourism and Heritage has informed Nova Scotia publishers that it is eliminating a \$700,000 fund that helps local publishers release more than 100 new books, most by local authors, every year.

“It’s drastic and devastating,” says Nimbus manager Terrilee Bulger. “Books are an important pillar of our culture. This budget decision by Premier Tim Houston’s government will mean that fewer Nova Scotian creators will get their books published. Not only that, Nova Scotian publishers will be forced to lay off staff, and spend less on local freelancers.”

This elimination of funding leaves Nova Scotia as the only province in Canada that does not support its book publishers and authors.

“Without this provincial support, we’ll have to cut new titles from 15 to 7,” says Formac CEO Jim Lorimer. “Books won’t get written, they won’t get published, and they won’t be there for readers to enjoy.”

Provincial Budget Notes

The **Annapolis Valley Regional Library (AVRL)** has received confirmation that there has been no increase to sustainable library funding for 2026-27. Funding has been maintained at the 2020-2025 levels. They are waiting for municipal budget decisions to be made in the next several weeks. After that, the AVRL Board will have the information it needs to make decisions about service changes. According to AVRL “the Bank of Canada’s Inflation Calendar shows that the cost of goods has increased by 43% since 2009. At the same time, AVRL’s funding has only increased by 10%.”

As part of its budget roll-out, the Province of Nova Scotia plans to spend \$6.8 million to contract **four dedicated fixed-wing water bombers** for Nova Scotia for wildfire operations. No more information is presently available.






