Local RCMP News

RCMP charge a man with firearm offences. Annapolis District RCMP has charged a man following a serious incident in Torbrook.

On February 10th, at approximately 9:50 am, Annapolis District RCMP responded to a firearms complaint at a home on Torbrook Rd. RCMP officers learned that a man and a woman had attended the residence to drop off food to a man known to them.

When they arrived, the man they were expecting to meet exited the house. A few minutes later, a second man, also known to them, exited the home, threatened the two who had brought food, and then shot at them with a shotgun.

The 46-year-old man and 37-year-old woman, both from Greenwood, fled the area in their vehicle. They were not physically injured.

At approximately 11:25 a.m., Annapolis District RCMP, assisted by Kings District RCMP, safely arrested the two men who voluntarily exited the home.

That afternoon, a search warrant was executed at the residence. During the search, RCMP officers located and seized a shotgun, ammunition and powder believed to be cocaine.

Cody Reid Palmer, 27, has been charged with: Discharging a Firearm with Intent Careless Use of a Firearm Pointing a Firearm Unauthorized Possession of a Firearm Possession of a Firearm Knowing its Possession is Unauthorized Possession of a Firearm Contrary to **Prohibition Order** Careless Storage of a Firearm **Uttering Threats** Failure to Comply with a Probation Order (two counts)

Palmer was remanded into custody and will appear in Digby Provincial on February 12, 2024, at 9:30 a.m. The second person arrested, a 28-year-old Torbrook man, was later released without charges.

The investigation is ongoing, with the assistance from the RCMP Forensic Identification Services.

RCMP Warns Nova Scotians About Romance Scams

Ahead of Valentine's Day, the RCMP is urging Nova Scotians to be mindful of fraudsters who pull on people's heart strings to pull off scams.

"Online dating, social media sites, and texting platforms are used by scammers to gain people's trust and affection for the sole purpose of stealing their money," says Cst. Mitch Thompson of the Nova Scotia RCMP Commercial Crime Section. "Unfortunately, people looking for companionship are regularly targeted by scammers - and instead of finding love, they end up with broken hearts and empty bank accounts."

The Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre reports that in 2023, 773 Canadians lost more than \$41,700,000 to romance scammers; 25% of victims were in the 60 to 69 age range. Between 2021 and 2023, Nova Scotians were scammed out of more than \$1,480,300, with the majority of victims, 22%, between the ages of 20 and 29.

Fraudsters create false identities and research potential victims online. To increase the likelihood of establishing a successful connection with their target, they develop a tailored strategy for each victim. After developing an online relationship, gaining the victim's trust, and pretending to have romantic feelings for them, the fraudster fakes a scenario where they need fast money.

"The scammers, who often claim to have a job in a distant location and no access to their existing funds, pretend to have either an emergency or an amazing opportunity," says. Cst. Thompson. "They then ask their victim for financial assistance."

The fraudsters request money or cryptocurrency for a variety of reasons; they sometimes say they're dealing with a medical emergency, travel problems, unexpected legal expenses or the purchase of high-value assets.

To help avoid romance scams:

Don't give out personal information (e.g., address, date of birth, banking credentials)

Don't respond to friend requests or text messages from people you don't know

Be suspicious of people who seem too good to be true, always have an excuse for not being able to meet in person, and are always dealing with crises that require money

Be suspicious of people you've never met in person who profess to love you

Never send money, cryptocurrency or gift cards to someone you've never met face-to-face, and be alert to unique investment opportunities

Be careful who you share pictures with; scammers can use them for blackmail

Anyone who suspects they've been targeted by a scam is encouraged to contact their local police and the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre at 1-888-495-8501. Mental Health Supports for Volunteer Firefighters, Ground Search and Rescue **Now Available**

Volunteer firefighters and volunteer members of ground search and rescue teams can now access new mental health supports - any time, at no cost.

The Nova Scotia Firefighter and Ground Search and Rescue Volunteer Assistance Program gives these first responders and their families access to a range of health and wellness services, including personal and family counselling, financial advice, stress management and nutrition advice, and more.

"Volunteer first responders play such an important role in communities across Nova Scotia where, in many cases, they are the first to respond in an emergency," said Brian Comer, Minister of Addictions and Mental Health. "This new program is a way to support our volunteer firefighters and ground search and rescue teams - to help the helpers who do so much for us."

The program includes counselling from mental health clinicians, available 24 hours a day, seven days a week in person, by phone or online.

The service is part of a two-year pilot program with Telus Health that will help the government better understand the mental health needs of volunteer firefighters and ground search and rescue volunteers.

Quick Facts:

- the Province is investing \$75,000 over two years for the program, announced in November
- there are about 6,000 volunteer firefighters and 1,200 ground search and rescue volunteers in Nova Scotia
- volunteer first responders can also access PSPNET, a free online service that provides mental health and well-being support to public safety personnel experiencing challenges related to anxiety, depression and post-traumatic stress




