Serious MVI in Litchfield

Annapolis District RCMP is investigating a serious motor vehicle crash that occurred in Litchfield. On February 15, 2024, at approximately 7:36 p.m., Annapolis District RCMP, fire and EHS responded to a motor vehicle crash on Shore Rd. RCMP officers learned that a White 2018 Hyundai Elantra with multiple occupants left the roadway and ended up in the ditch.

A passenger, an 11-year-old child was airlifted to Halifax by Life Flight with serious injuries. Two passengers, a 4-year-old and a 9-year-old child were transported to hospital by ambulance with serious injuries. The driver, a 37-year-old Litchfield man, was transported to hospital with serious injuries.

From information and evidence gathered at the scene, investigators believe alcohol was a factor in the collision. The investigation is ongoing

New central appointment booking telephone line replaces after hour clinic phone lines in Annapolis Valley

A new toll-free telephone number for booking same day appointments replaces the former numbers for the after-hours clinics at Eastern Kings Memorial Health Centre (EKM) in Wolfville and Western Kings Memorial Health Centre (WKM) in Berwick.

Same day appointments should be for urgent issues that do not need to be seen in an emergency department but do need attention on that day. People who have a primary care provider (doctor or nurse practitioner), and are attached to a family practice, should call their office first to see if any same day appointments are available. If you are unable to get an appointment with your primary care provider, or if you do not have a primary care provider, you can call the new number to book an appointment at one of the same day clinic locations in the Annapolis Valley. **The new number is: 1-833-710-0110** - Telephone lines open starting at 8am, Monday to Friday and will remain open until filled.

Most family practices have same day appointments. Appointments are also available weekly at four locations: EKM in Wolfville, Annapolis/Kings Primary Care Clinic in Kentville, WKM in Berwick and Annapolis/Kings Primary Care Clinic in Middleton.

"We expect this new central booking line will allow patients to have better access to care at these clinics," said Jen Kelday, Manager, Primary Health.

The Urgent Treatment Centre (UTC) at Annapolis Community Health Centre should continue to be accessed as usual by calling the UTC at 902-532-4011 or visiting the UTC in person on Mondays, Wednesdays or Fridays, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. More information on the Annapolis Urgent Treatment Centre is online.

People who require non-emergency level of care are asked to consider one of the options below:


The time of day, place and date are noted on the back as well as an excerpt, from my journal on that day, placed so as to mimic a postcard, an archaic form of communication in this day of technology.




