Outdoor Burning Restrictions Start March 15

Although Nova Scotia has seen plenty of rain and other precipitation recently, conditions can now change rapidly, making wildfires a constant risk until late Fall. Catastrophic wildfires in 2023 destroyed many homes and huge swaths of forest land in Nova Scotia.

During wildfire risk season (15 March to 15 October), no domestic brush burning or campfires are allowed between 8:00am and 2:00pm, except industrial permits. During wildfire risk season, burn restrictions are updated daily at 2:00pm at https://novascotia.ca/burnsafe/

The Burn Safe Map is colour-coded to show when and if outdoor burning can take place in all areas of the province. According to the Burn Safe site:

"Red means no open fires. The map is always red between 8:00am and 2:00 pm because this is when wildfire risk is highest. When daily fire restrictions are updated at 2:00pm, some or all counties may be red on the map due to dry and/or windy conditions that make burning unsafe.

"Yellow means open fires are only allowed after 7:00pm. Fires must be out by 8:00am the following day. Some or all counties may be yellow on the map when conditions are safer for burning in only the evening. Typically, humidity is higher, and winds and temperatures are lower in the evening.

"Green means open fires are allowed after 2:00pm. Fires must be out by 8:00am the following day. Some or all counties may be green on the map when there has been rain, making it safer to burn.

"The map may show areas in yellow or red soon after it has rained. It only takes a day after rain for grass and fine fuels to get dry enough to ignite and become a wildfire." Learn more at https://novascotia.ca/burnsafe/

Heating Assistance Rebate Program

If you haven't applied yet, the deadline is March 31 to apply for a \$600 energy rebate from the province. Eligible home heating costs include oil, electricity, natural gas, wood, wood pellets, coal, ad other heating sources. You need to pay for your own home heat. If you rent your home, the cost of heating can't be included in the rent.

• To qualify for the rebate, you need to pay for your own home (residential) heat and meet 1 of the following criteria: have a 2022 net income of \$55,000 or less and live alone with no kids or

dependents

- have a combined 2022 net household income of \$75,000 or less and live with kids, dependents or other adults
- receive Income Assistance from the Department of Community Services
- receive the Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS) or the Allowance from Service Canada







The Centrelea Community Hall began its life as a one room schoolhouse (1867-1959). In 1960 it was moved from its original site (the Britex Plant) to where it is today.



From the RCMP: How to Spot and Avoid Online Marketplace Scams

The Nova Scotia RCMP is urging the public to remain vigilant and take proactive measures to safeguard themselves against scammers when buying, selling, or searching for a rental online.

The digital flea market has grown to be a major part of people's everyday lives. Online platforms like Facebook Marketplace and Kijiji have made it easier than ever to turn unwanted items into cash or search for your next apartment of vacation rental.

Unfortunately, it has also made it easier to become a victim of a scam.

Online scams are one of the most commonly reported frauds to police. Scammers will try to sell an item – often at a very cheap price – just so they can steal your payment card or personal information. They may also take your money and send you a worthless item, or sometimes nothing at all.

Scammers have also been known to contact sellers and offer to purchase items via e-Transfer. The victim is texted a QR code to accept the transfer and prompted to enter their banking information. The e-Transfer is fake, and the victim provides their banking information to the scammer.

Protect yourself when conducting business online by taking the following precautions:

- If possible, conduct transactions in person, in public, and in cash.
- Don't provide passwords for e-Transfers ahead of receiving an item. Remember that it can be extremely difficult to reverse an e-Transfer sent to someone with autodeposit active.
- Do not accept e-Transfers via QR codes or emailed cheques.
- Beware of advertisements offering popular or hard-to-find items at a discount.
- Do not send deposits to hold items. Also, it is illegal under the Residential Tenancy Act to require a deposit to apply for tenancy any rental ad requiring a deposit is likely a scam.
- Use a reverse image search program to see if the pictures in the ad have been used elsewhere.
- Remember that social media accounts can be faked or compromised just because someone is linked to you through a community or friends does not mean they are trustworthy.





No recyclables, cardboard or yard waste are accepted for clean-up.

*Please remove batteries from items. Batteries can be brought in to the management centres or other participating locations for free.

Bagged items must be in clear bags. Smaller items must be bagged.

Maximum of 20 items will be collected at any one stop. An item means a single object, bag or container or securely tied bundle. A bundle can measure up to 4ft in length. Weight restrictions above.

Items not collected are the responsibility of the resident and must be removed from roadside when Clean-up is finished.

Spring Clean-Up Soon

Valley Waste offers two bulky waste clean-ups a year, one in the Spring and one in the Fall. Valley Waste Resource Management provides recycling and trash disposal services for the Municipalities Kings and Annapolis. This is your opportunity to rid your home and property of bulky waste such as broken appliances, discarded furniture, lumber and construction waste, and the general accumulation of clutter and debris. Below are guidelines for what can and can't be put out. More info is available on the Valley Waste calendars or on their site, <u>www.vwrm.com</u> Calendars can still be picked up at many local businesses but especially at local libraries.

County of Annapolis residents only (excluding the Towns of Middleton and Annapolis Royal, and Bear River First Nation): Spring/Fall Clean-up occurs on your regular scheduled waste collection day or alternate day due to holiday during the weeks specified. Spring Clean-up: April 9-19, 2024

Middleton, Annapolis Royal, and Bear River First Nations: May 13th to May 17th.

County of Kings, Towns of Wolfville, Kentville, Berwick, Middleton, and Annapolis Royal, Glooscap, Annapolis, and Bear River First Nations: Spring/Fall Clean-up occurs on the OPPOSITE WEEK to your regular scheduled waste collection day. Items must be curbside on the Sunday of your Clean-up week. The truck will come once during that week. Please refer to the table on the map. For example, if your regular collection day is Friday Week 2, your Spring Clean-up week will be April 22-26, 2024.
