Getting to Know: Chris Fertnig, Port Royal Sport Fishing

I believe that I was born a fisherman. No one in my family had a clue about fishing and my parents never even held a fishing rod. From the age of six I was obsessed with fishing and I still am. If anything, my passion for angling has increased. I've been fishing for 50 years and fly-fishing for 38 of those years.

I have a deep affection for Nova Scotia and particularly for the valley and the headwater systems of the Medway and Mersey watersheds. What we have here is very special. The beauty of our forests, rivers and lakes deserve care and protection. I'm a conservationist at heart and I strongly promote catch and release fishing for our wild brook trout (speckled trout), though there's nothing wrong with keeping a couple of tasty 10-12" trout for the pan. With striped bass returning in growing numbers, we are enjoying some great sport on the Annapolis and Bear Rivers. I particularly like fishing for them on a fly rod, but I am happy to take people out using conventional tackle.

My guided trips are walk & wade half-day (4 hrs on the water) or full-days (8 hours on the water). My trout guiding season is April - June and I guide striped bass June through to November. Smallmouths are a blast to fish with a spinning rod or fly rod in the summer months from our square stern canoe. I also return to trout in September. I can outfit clients with all the tackle they require. Food and drinks are provided. I have first aid/CPR training and my guiding certification is completed in May.

I welcome newcomers of all ages and backgrounds to the sport. I always remind people that fish do not care how old you are, what your gender is or what your lifestyle is. Get outside with Port Royal Sport Fishing and enjoy the natural beauty southwest Nova Scotia. Contact: 902-250-0807,

Flying Officer Robert Fitzgerald Conroy Royal Canadian Air Force 429 Squadron, 6 Bomber Group

Having participated in the last raid of the Second World War on Berlin, Gerald Conroy, pilot of Halifax bomber LV914, was attacked by Luftwaffe Hauptmann Heinz Roekker late at night of March 24, 1944. Previously, on June 11, 1943, as pilot of Wellington bomber HE593, he was attacked in Holland. Due to a communications malfunction, all his crew was killed. He was not captured and evaded to Gibraltar with the assistance of a number of underground organizations, then to England and thence to home in Nova Scotia for recuperation leave. His nieces Elizabeth McMichael and Rae Jodrey have fond memories of that always-cherished time. It is impossible to know what was on his mind a year later in Germany, but he stayed at the controls while his crew evacuated. "Get out, get out" were the last words Gerald uttered as he ordered the crew's engineer to jump out of the heavily damaged Halifax. Elizabeth and her husband Alex Morrison have travelled to Germany, met Hauptmann Roekker, and made peace. They visited the fatal crash site and conversed with local residents who remember the crash and saw the surviving crew members parachute to safety. Gerald gave his life for his colleagues and for Canada. Lest we forget! (submitted)
