Annapolis County Council Approves budget and 5-Year Plan

Council approves 2024-2025 Operating Budget and 5-Year Capital Investment Plan; County tax rate maintained but Bridgetown Community tax rate sees increase.

Municipal Council's approval of the 2024-2025 operating budget and 5-Year Capital Investment Plan means big projects, big improvements, and ambitious goals.

"Council has given serious and extensive consideration to the budget process," said Warden Alex Morrison. "We (Council) have drafted a budget that is ambitious and positive in approach, and one that plans for the wellbeing of our citizens."

The county-wide base tax rate will remain at \$1.025 for residential and resources properties per \$100 of assessment, and \$1.80 per \$100 of assessment for commercial properties.

However, Bridgetown's community rates will see an increase of 5.36 cents to 45.31 cents for residential and resource per \$100 of assessment, and an increase of 8.99 cents to 74.13 cents for commercial per \$100 of assessment. This increase allows for specific services to Bridgetown, such as former Bridgetown debt payments, increases in road and street maintenance costs, as well as an additional \$47,000 directly to Bridgetown Fire Department.

The 5-Year Capital Investment Plan focuses on municipal infrastructure with upgrades and extensions of water and sewer services in Lequille, Bridgetown, and Bear River. These are the initial year-one capital investments, which will be followed up in years two-five with more capital infrastructure investments planned for communities in both the east and west ends.

"Our capital plan is positive and aggressive," noted Morrison. "But not being positive and aggressive would see our communities fall behind. We need to plan for community growth."

A few highlighted items in the plan are - the installation of more generators at wastewater treatment plants, improvements to community recreation facilities through accessible trail development in Upper Clements and accessible playground improvements in Nictaux, and in year two, a major upgrade to Granville Ferry Water Tower to ensure the long-term sustainability of potable water to Granville Ferry, Annapolis Royal and Lequille.

The biggest capital item in the 5-year plan is the construction of a new \$40 million recreation complex in 2027-2028 to replace current aging facilities and to create a modern facility for families to enjoy multiple ways to continue to be active.

In regard to the operating budget, communities can expect more services and programs.

"We understand that property assessments have increased, and costs have increased. As a municipality, we too have been affected by rising costs which we see in our purchasing and tendering for capital projects that are sometime coming in double what we have budgeted."

"Council has done their best to balance the continuing inflationary costs, while ensuring that county growth was supported and managed wisely and strategically, added Morrison. "Council feels this budget reflects a balance of managing growth while limiting financial impacts on our communities to small amounts."

Morrison explained that many of the larger financial costs are outside of the Municipality's ability to control such as items mandated by the province like education and policing service; however, in addition to the non-discretional spending, Council was able to make investments in 2024-2025.

A detailed look at the 2024-25 budget will be available on the County website in the coming

"Council appreciates the support and encouragement received from community members," said Morrison. "Through citizens' trust, Council can build quality infrastructure and programs for our most vulnerable and support our next generation of community leaders: our youth."

"Thank you to all members of Council and staff for their willingness to come together and make sacrifices to achieve a balanced budget and support significant capital investments to grow Annapolis County in the years ahead." (provided by County of Annapolis)

Council Passes Marketing Levy

At their March 19 meeting, Annapolis County Municipal Council approved the final reading of the new M8 Marketing Levy Bylaw.

In late 2022, the provincial government passed legislation providing municipalities the ability to charge a tax on all short-term accommodations, the revenue received to be used for tourism marketing. At the time the province stated that all other provinces have some sort of marketing tax and that the maximum allowed of 3% was lower than the average across the country.

First step for a municipality was to pass a bylaw giving the local government the ability to enforce a program. Annapolis County's levy will now charge 3% of the cost of accommodation in rental units or rooms "as lodging in hotels and motels and in any other facility required to be registered under the Tourist Accommodation Registration Act..."

There are some exemptions. All operators are required to obtain certificate of registration. The effective date of the bylaw is June 1, 2024.







Annapolis County Council Highlights March 19, 2024

2024-2025 Budget:

Municipal Council approved the draft 2024-25 operating budget reflecting revenues of \$25,789,443, expenditures of \$25,786,839, and a residual surplus of \$2,603.

Municipal Council approved a 2024-25 operating budget taxation base rate for all residential and resource assessments of 1.025 per \$100 of assessment, and a commercial tax rate of \$1.80 per \$100 of assessment for all commercial assessments.

Municipal Council approved a 2024-25 operating budget taxation area rate for all residential and resource assessments in Bridgetown of 45.31 cents per \$100 of assessment, and a commercial taxation area rate in Bridgetown of 74.13 cents per \$100 of assessment, and a taxation area rate for all properties in Assessment District 12 (Lawrencetown) of the amount to be approved by the Lawrencetown Village Commission.

Municipal Council approved fire hydrant taxation rates for the 2024-25 fiscal year based on \$100 of assessment:

- Margaretsville (District 2) 18.69 cents
- Inglewood (District 3) 18.90 cents
- Granville Ferry (Districts 4 & 5) 17.05 cents
- Carleton Corner (District 7) 15.40 cents
- Church Road (District 3) 14.43 cents
- Middleton (Districts 2 & 10) 19.34 cents
- Cornwallis Park (District 6) 22.82 cents
- Bridgetown (Districts 3 & 7) 30.68 cents

Municipal Council approved a 2024-25 operating budget taxation area rate for all assessment accounts of 3.67 cents per \$100 of assessment, for the provision of streetlights county-wide.

Municipal Council approved fire taxation rates for the 2024-25 fiscal year as follows based on \$100 of assessment:

- Kingston Fire (Districts 1 & 11) amount authorized by Kingston Fire Commission
- Fire Capital (all Districts) 6.11 cents

Municipal Council approved street paving taxation rates for the 2024-25 fiscal year as follows based on \$100 of assessment:

- Chipman/Baxter (District 9) 5.38 cents
- Cameron Drive (District 1) 2.26 cents
- Brookside/Pine Grove (District 1) 5.57 cents
- Bradley Street (District 1) 3.75 cents
- And, that Ward Estates (District 11), be charged a lump sum amount of \$373.65 in lieu of a taxation rate.

Municipal Council approved the due date for taxes of June 30, 2024, and that all rates and taxes remaining outstanding after this date be subject to interest at a rate of 12% per year, compounded monthly.






