2:45pm Wildhood (14A) This remarkable second feature from Bretten Hannam follows two-spirit Mi'kmaw teenager Link (Lewitski) on a remarkable journey of self discovery set against the gorgeous backdrop of the



Annapolis Valley. After finding out that his estranged mother may be alive, Link and his brother (Winters-Anthony) escape from their abusive father and set out to find her, helped along their way by Pasmay (Odjick), a young drifter who helps Link come to terms with his newfound sexuality.

Adapted from Hannam's award-winning short film Wildfire, this realistic coming of age story is full of hope, love and heartbreak, and is a bold addition to the new wave of Indigenous filmmaking.

5:00pm Ru (14A, French language) After a perilous journey across the pacific, a family of Vietnamese refugees settles in Montreal, in the hopes of starting a new life. Through a series of flashbacks, the whole picture of their story comes into view, as seen by the youngest family member, Tinh (Djandji), who is still processing the trauma of what they left behind and struggling with her new setting and language.

Brilliantly adapted from Kim Thúy's Governor General Award-winning novel of the same name, this compassionate story of resilience in the face of adversity is stunningly captured and deeply moving.

7:30pm Blackberry (PG) From its humble origins in Waterloo, ON, in 1996, nobody expected the massive global success that the world's first smartphone would become. Nobody, that is, except Jim Balsillie (Howerton). Taking a chance on thenstruggling startup Research in Motion (RIM), he joins BlackBerry creators Mike Lazaridis (Baruchel) and Douglas Fregin (Johnson) as co-CEO. Together, they form a massive multinational tech giant, but the power and wealth soon begin to eat away at their relationship, putting everything they built into jeopardy.

Based loosely on the true story of the extraordinary development and spectacular demise of the Blackberry, this high-stakes comedy featuring an all-star cast is a bona fide crowd pleaser and critical darling.

Low Income Property Tax Reduction Application 2024/25 Tax Year

The Council of the Municipality of the County of Annapolis has directed, by policy, that an exemption from taxation will be granted for the taxation year April 1, 2024- March 31, 2025, pursuant to Section 69 of the Municipal Government Act in an amount up to \$400.

- You must be a resident of Annapolis County in the Province of Nova Scotia; and
- Own the assessed property and occupy it as your principal residence; and
- ANNUAL income from all sources for the 2023 calendar year for yourself, spouse, common-law spouse and other persons over the age of 18, that resided in the same household, was equal to or less than \$30,000 (based on line 15000 of the income tax Notice of Assessment).

EXEMPTION VALUE:

- The exemptions provided will be based on the following income levels:
- If the residential property taxes are less than the exemption value, then the exemption will equal the full amount of the tax invoice.

Annual Income	Tax Exemption	
Equal to or under \$30,000	Up to \$400	

Where such property is jointly owned, only one tax exemption shall be provided per property and the sharing in such exemption shall be on the basis of proportion of ownership in such joint property.

- After you have filed your personal income tax for 2023, AND received your Notice of Assessment from Canada Revenue Agency, complete the Low Income Property Tax Reduction Application
- Attach copies of the 2023 Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) Notice of Assessment for each adult residing in the home
- Tax exemptions will only be approved for those applicants who provide copies of their CRA Notice of Assessments for 2023



- If you do not have your CRA Notice of Assessment, you can call 1-800-959-8281.
- Applications must be received by the Municipality no later than December 31, 2024. Applicants must re-apply


