Olympic Sprinter Returns to Bridgetown to Offer Free Speed Clinic

Jenna Martin-Evans first came to Bridgetown as a young sprinting phenom. She arrived as a student of the legendary coach Charlie Scarrow. This week, she returns as the teacher. After a lifetime running around tracks, you could say her life has come full circle.

Grade 1-12 students are invited for a free speed clinic with Jenna, this Wednesday. Please arrive between 5-6pm to register and sign waivers. The clinic will run from 6-8pm.

Acceleration and speed are powerful elements of many sports. So, the clinic will develop critical skills for all young athletes, not just budding track stars.

"What originally got me interested in track and field was that it was different from any of the other sports I played," Martin-Evans told The Canadian Way. "I love team sports, but this was a sport that I could isolate myself with and there's no greater feeling than crossing the line in first."

This 1st Annual Speed Camp is offered in memory of Charlie Scarrow. Jenna's journey to world-class excellence started on the crushed rock and chalk lines of the old BRHS track. All the way to the 400m semi-finals of the 2012 Olympic Games in London, she has always honoured Charlie's influence.

"I naturally had a gift that drew me closer to it," "When I met my soon to be long-term coach and mentor, Charles Scarrow, it was the beginning of a great venture in which the term 'the sky is the limit' became real."

When Scarrow passed in 2014, he left a legacy that spans the continent, in boxing and track and field. These achievements were honoured when he was named Nova Scotia's Athletics Coach of the Year in 2006. Here in the Valley, he will always be remembered as a tireless community builder who touched countless lives as a volunteer and coach.

Jenna is but one of the athletes affected by Charlie's deep conviction that anything is possible with belief and hard work. When she first came to train in Bridgetown, she boarded with her coach. With his encouragement and guidance, she made the leap to the University of Kentucky, then on to represent Canada on the world stage.

After retiring from competition, Jenna moved to the US to start her family. Much has changed at the Bridgetown track where she got her start. The old school track, built by hand over decades by volunteers, has been replaced by a state of the art, international standard synthetic track and field facility capable of housing all Olympic athletics events. It is flanked by multiple artificial and natural soccer pitches, beach volleyball, tennis and pickleball courts, and plans for more to come.

Nearby, the Bridgetown Sports Hall of Fame showcases decades of individual and team champions, and the generations of passionate volunteers and builders who have supported them. Like Jenna, they've all turned dreams into reality. As the Hub continues to develop activities for everyone, from local seniors and students to visiting elite athletes, this tradition has come full circle, too.

Community Infrastructure Funding in Annapolis, Digby Counties

Major improvements are coming to community facilities and trails located in Annapolis and Digby counties with recently announced provincial grants.

"Enhancing infrastructure can positively affect the social, emotional and physical aspects of many individuals," said Jill Balser, Minister of Labour, Skills and Immigration and MLA for Digby-Annapolis, on behalf of Allan MacMaster, Minister of Communities, Culture, Tourism and Heritage. "These spaces can foster a sense of connection, offer a safe environment, and promote personal growth to help achieve desired goals and objectives."

The volunteer-run Annapolis Community Pool in Annapolis Royal received \$200,000 to install a pool liner. The pool provides swim lessons and other recreational programming, as well as employment for young lifeguards. Along with money from fundraisers and donations, this grant allows the Pool Society to move ahead with repairs that closed the pool this year.

The Searidge Foundation in Annapolis Royal, which operates a treatment centre that supports people struggling with drug addiction dependencies, received \$48,000 to install heat pumps in the centre.

Annapolis Heritage Society, over \$27,000 to renovate storage space at Carriage House

Middleton Railway Museum Society, over \$19,000 to bring a 1920s CN caboose to the museum from Truro

Digby Area Learning Association, over \$18,000 for improvements to classroom space and electrical system

Electric City/La Nouvelle France Society, over \$42,000

La Société Vieille Maison, \$40,000

Freeport Community Development Association, over \$6,000







Nova Scotians can now apply for disaster financial assistance for <u>uninsurable losses</u> related to flash flooding in the Annapolis Valley and surrounding areas two weeks ago.

"This has been another devastating storm and an incredibly difficult time for Nova Scotians," said John Lohr, Minister responsible for the Emergency Management Office. "These were powerful thunderstorms that caused flash flooding and severe damage. We want to help people get the support they need to make repairs."

The Province's Disaster Financial Assistance Program is designed to help Nova Scotians, municipalities, small businesses and not-for-profit organizations get back on their feet after a major storm or natural disaster.

The program covers uninsurable losses for eligible households, small businesses and not-for-profit organizations. Applications are available at:

Nova Scotians are asked to continue to assess damage, keep all receipts, take pictures and videos, and work with their insurance companies. The deadline for applications is October 31.

You Should Know:

Disaster financial assistance does not replace private insurance; only uninsurable damage is eligible.

People who are not sure if their insurance covers the damage should contact their insurance company or broker, or the Insurance Bureau of Canada at 1-844-227-5422

Applications are assessed for eligibility and losses must be verified by an adjuster.







Road Naming Process – Municipal Council will initiate the road naming review process to name a new shared access road in Meadowvale.

<u>Planning Advisory Committee (Habitation)</u> – Municipal Council gave first reading of its intent to adopt the Habitation Committee Secondary Planning Strategy and Land Use Bylaw dated July 2024, with the necessary amendments to the Annapolis County Municipal Planning Strategy, Future Land Use Map (FLUM) and Zoning Maps, and set a Public Hearing date of Tuesday, September 17, 2024, 2:00pm, at the Municipal Administration building (752 St. George St., Annapolis Royal).

Planning Advisory Committee (Upper Clements) - Municipal Council gave first reading of its intent to adopt the Upper Clements Area Secondary Planning Strategy and Land Use Bylaw dated July 2024, and set a Public Hearing date of Tuesday, September 17, 2024, 2:00pm, at the Municipal Administration building (752 St. George St., Annapolis Royal).

Intermunicipal Inclusion, Diversity, Equity and Accessibility Plan (IDEA) – Municipal Council endorsed the concept of a joint countywide Intermunicipal Inclusion, Diversity, Equity and Accessibility structure, with a proposed committee terms of reference and specific details of the workplan to be brought forward to council in the fall for final review and potential adoption.

<u>Audited Financial Statements</u> – Municipal Council adopted the audited financial statements for the year ended March 31, 2023; Council accepted the Audit Strategy and confirmed Grant Thornton to carry out the 2023-24 audit.

CDC Dog Import Requirements

Starting August 1, 2024, all dogs entering the United States must meet new US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) requirements, and owners/importers must certify fulfillment of those requirements before transiting the border.

All dogs must be at least six months of age, be microchipped, appear healthy upon arrival, have an export document signed by a licensed veterinarian, and have a completed CDC Dog Import Form. These rules apply to all dogs, including service animals, and apply to land, air, or sea entry to the United States. Owners and importers will need to complete these requirements each time they cross into the United States. Dogs that have been in countries other than Canada may have additional requirements.
