



Bear River Water System Project Update

(per County of Annapolis)
Phase 1: Completed by Miesner Excavation and
Gillespie Horticulture Services.

Phase 2: Approximately 25% is complete with water main installed from the Bear River bridge to roughly 20 meters from the intersection of Pleasant Street and Lansdowne Road. Work is expected to take place on Pleasant Street the week of September 23rd. The expected completion date is late October. Work being done by Renovamen Contracting LTD.

Phase 3: Approximately 80% is complete with roughly two more weeks of work to do on Clementsvale Road with another two weeks of work on the Bear River bridge, expected completion date is mid October. Work being done by Miesner Excavation and Gillespie Horticulture Services.

Phase 4: Not yet tendered, expected to be tendered in the coming weeks.

Comfort station is yet to be finalized awaiting ACOA funding and other approvals.

The Municipality of the County of Annapolis will be opening a satellite office two days a week in Middleton to serve east end residents more conveniently. The location, days, and times will be posted soon. The County is presently seeking to hire a parttime Finance Clerk for this office.






