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Atlantic Hurricane Season Here

Be Ready Before the Storm. Annapolis Regional Emergency Management Organization (Annapolis REMO) is reminding everyone that the 2025 Atlantic Hurricane Season begins on June 1 and continues through November 30.

According to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), this will be an above-normal season with 13 to 19 named storms expected, that may result in six to ten hurricanes, with three to five being major hurricanes that could have potential winds exceeding 119 km/h.

he region continues to reflect on the widespread impact of Hurricane Fiona in 2022, which resulted in loss of life, severe coastal flooding, prolonged power outages, massive tree damage, and over \$800 million in damages across Atlantic Canada.

“Don’t wait until a storm is on the horizon,” said Brian Orde, Annapolis REMO Coordinator. “Preparing now, before a hurricane threatens, can significantly reduce the impact to you, your family, and your property. Planning ahead truly makes all the difference.”

Five Key Steps to Prepare for Hurricane Season:

Develop a Family Emergency Plan

Discuss evacuation routes, identify meeting locations, and establish a communication strategy in the event of separation. Ensure your plan includes provisions for pets and individuals with special needs.

Build or Update Your Emergency Kit

Your kit should include drinking water, non-perishable food, a flashlight, batteries, a first-aid kit, cash, necessary medications, hygiene supplies, and copies of important documents.

Prepare Your Property

Inspect your home for potential hazards, secure loose outdoor items, clear gutters, and ensure sump pumps and backup power sources are functional.

Stay Informed

Sign up for local emergency alerts through Alertable to receive timely warnings and critical updates. Visit www.annapolisremo.ca to register for alerts via landline, mobile phone, text, MS Teams, and other platforms. You can also download the free Alertable app for iOS and Android devices.

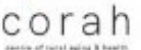

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Time For Celebration!
On June 10, 2025, the United Church of Canada will be 100-years old. The community of faith at the William Black Pastoral Charge will be celebrating this landmark birthday.

Our 100th Anniversary Service will be on June 8 at St. Alphonsus Catholic Church, our home since Gordon Providence United Church was decommissioned, and will be led by the Reverend Don Macpherson.

The United Church of Canada was born on June 10, 1925, when the Methodist, Congregationalist, and most Presbyterian churches came together in union to better serve our young nation. Its future was by no means certain, yet in the post- WWII years, the United Church was booming. The denomination became known for its adherence to the “social gospel”, with actions of social justice walking hand in hand with Christian worship.

Today’s United Church faces the same dwindling numbers as many Christian denominations. However, we remain dedicated to heartfelt worship that continues to spread the Good News of the gospels with an inclusive mindset committed to social justice practices. At the William Black Pastoral Charge, we welcome everyone to join us in building community and seeking spiritual growth. We are a Christian denomination, guided by the teachings of Jesus, but we also believe that the Holy One’s love embraces all loving spiritualities, and that we all have a shared responsibility to our earth and all its inhabitants.

Here in Bridgetown, our former United Church was built in 1872 and was originally Providence Methodist Church. It later became Gordon Providence United Church. Worship continued there until the building’s decommissioning and transformation to the Dawn Oman Art Gallery, and we found ourselves searching for a new home. In our need, we were generously embraced by our Roman Catholic neighbours and welcomed to share space with the St. Alphonsus Church Catholic congregation. There, we have continued to serve the community and find spiritual solace as the William Black Pastoral Charge.

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Nova Scotia Removes More Interprovincial Trade Barriers

New regulations will allow more types of commercial trucks and other passenger vehicles to enter and operate in the province, supporting the movement of goods and services across the country. Previously, certain vehicles have not been allowed in Nova Scotia even though they are registered in another jurisdiction. The Province will be introducing legislative changes to enhance the new Traffic Safety Act in the fall, which will enable these changes to be made permanent.

“Nova Scotia wants to see free trade nationwide, and we are leading by looking within our own regulations and practices to see where we can remove barriers,” said Premier Tim Houston. “If a vehicle can operate in another province or territory, it should be able to operate in Nova Scotia. We are removing needless and burdensome barriers. This is another example of how we are taking a Team Canada approach to creating a more prosperous future.”

In recognizing out-of-province registrations, the Registrar of Motor Vehicles will still have the ability to place special conditions on a vehicle’s operation to ensure safety and protect infrastructure, as is the case with Nova Scotian vehicles. This could include limiting commercial vehicle access to certain roads and bridges and age requirements for passengers in passenger vehicles. Vehicles will be required to comply with all other existing provisions of the Motor Vehicle Act, including inspections and insurance.

Nova Scotia is also announcing plans to amend the Nova Scotia Building Code Regulations to allow factory-built (modular) buildings that meet the National Building Code to be installed in the province without having to meet additional Nova Scotia-specific standards.

Currently, manufacturers are required to redesign the same building model for every province depending on that province’s standards. This increases costs, causes delays and creates barriers for standardization and interprovincial trade.

The proposed amendments to the Nova Scotia Building Code Regulations will:

- enhance productivity and accelerate the development of new modular housing
- allow modular construction contractors to work to one national code, rather than individual provincial codes
- position Nova Scotia as national leaders in housing innovation and reduction of interprovincial trade barriers
- position Nova Scotia as an easy export destination for modular housing and invite reciprocal recognition for Nova Scotian manufacturers from other provinces and territories.

The proposed changes to the Nova Scotia Building Code Regulations only apply to factory-built construction.

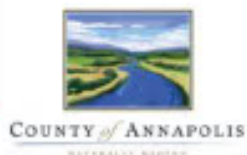
