Digby Women's A Cappella Chorus

Can women sing barbershop harmony? A newly forming women's chorus in Digby wants a chance to show that they can... and how! On Monday, June 23, those interested are invited to check out the launch of the Digby women's a cappella chorus at 7pm at the Digby Baptist Church (DBC), 2 Mount Street. Members will decide on a final name for the chorus later.

Co-organizer Julie Lindholm Schwingbeck, whose family roots go back 242 years in Digby County when her empire loyalist ancestors settled in Gulliver's Cove, serves on the International Board of Harmony Inc., a non-profit organization of women united by a shared love of a cappella 4-part harmony in the barbershop style. She notes, "The new chorus offers a space for enriching lives through singing, education and friendship. To join, you don't have to be from Digby, be an experienced singer or be able to read music. We are here to help people develop their vocal abilities and personal goals, wherever they are at. It is important to us that each person finds joy and connectedness through singing together with this unique group of women."

What can you expect at the June 23 launch? Schwingbeck explains, "Besides providing an introduction to barbershop harmony, leaders will help singers identify whether they will be most comfortable singing melody or a specific harmony part. Participants will have the opportunity to sing, sing, sing!" She encourages people to register via the link on the chorus' Facebook page (information below) if interested in attending, so that organizers can share more detailed information.

The Digby women's a cappella chorus adds a new style of singing to the area, which also boasts The Fundy Chorale, a community choir of women in Digby who have been active for over 18 years. Schwingbeck notes that the new chorus hopes to share their love of singing with the community through performances for all audiences, including at churches, schools, hospitals, and senior centres, and contribute to charitable projects.

'A cappella' refers to singing without instrumental accompaniment, and has its roots in the Italian Renaissance, literally meaning 'in chapel style'. The barbershop style of singing originated in North America in the late 1800s. Since then, it has grown into a favorite pastime worldwide and is growing locally.

In addition to future fundraising, chorus organizers are currently seeking sponsors and donors to help them build harmony across the community and hit the right notes on opening night. Donations in any amount help sustain and grow important programs that further develop chorus excellence and community relevance. Further information is available on their Facebook page (see below).

Watercolour is such a vast subject, there are so many possibilities! During these 2 hours, we will cover the main information that will enable you to get started and enjoy creating with this amazing media. Here is a non-exhaustive overview of the session: We will see the supplies you need to start, such as the different sorts of papers, the importance of a quality paper 100% cotton, the brushes, paints and other supplies, and also some of the techniques (wet on wet, wet on dry, layering, lifting some colour, putting some salt, the use of masking fluid...). Some key points in watercolour: water control, paint consistency (cream, milk, coffee, tea), brush strokes depending on the brushes, composition, use of the colours (light to dark, using the white of the paper). And above all, for maximum enjoyment, we'll be putting all this theoretical knowledge into practice. Have fun!

Province Releases Second Annual Human Rights Remedy Progress Report

More Nova Scotians with disabilities are living in community, receiving individualized planning support and funding, and engaging in building the future of disability support after two years of progress on the Nova Scotia Human Rights Remedy. In its second annual progress report, submitted May 30, the government reported exact compliance with 20 targets and substantial progress on the remaining eight.

The Nova Scotia Human Rights Remedy is a landmark decision that recognizes the systemic discrimination faced by Nova Scotians with disabilities. In 2021, a human rights case found that the Province of Nova Scotia had discriminated against people with disabilities by failing to provide adequate community-based support. This ruling was the result of a human rights complaint filed by three individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities, along with a systemic complaint brought forward by the Disability Rights Coalition.

The Remedy outlines the steps the government must take to make sure people with disabilities have real choices about where and how they live, with the right supports in place. The goal is to ensure more inclusive, community-based support with more choices for people with disabilities.

The Remedy provides a guide as the government closes large residential facilities for people living with disabilities and transitions them to supported community living. This guide consists of six interconnected key directions:

- a new system of individualized planning and support co-ordination to drive more person-directed and local community-based supports and services
- closing institutions
- building a broader system of community-based supports and services to support a home and life in the local community
- provincewide multidisciplinary support program with regional hubs including other clinical supports to support local options
- individualized funding as the basis of the transformed system with “backbone” support functions
- strengthening whole disability system capacity to enable transformation to a human rights approach

The ultimate legally required outcome is the remedying of the discrimination for people with disabilities in Nova Scotia by 2028.

In the second year, among other announced achievements, the government:

- ended all new admissions to adult residential centres, regional rehabilitation centres and residential facilities, effective January 1, 2025
- reduced the institutionalized population by 189 – 22 per cent over the baseline set in January 2023
- connected another 124 people to intensive planning and support coordinators now working on transition planning
- reduced the wait list for services by 50 per cent over baseline by supporting 293 more people with disabilities, exceeding the remedy’s target

However, the CBC is reporting that while the report says as of April 1 there were 189 fewer people in larger institutions, that number is about two-thirds of the goal of 261 people the government had set for this spring. There was also little progress in the two-year goal of moving about 110 adults under 65 out of nursing homes. The target of creating a program where citizens adapt and share their homes with people with disabilities – referred to as “homeshare” – was also behind schedule.
