FODAR 2025 Jumps into the World of Hip Hop

Festival of Dance Annapolis Royal runs July 15 - 19

Moving into different territory this year, FODAR adds a new event to its schedule. The All Styles Street Dance Battle will run at Market Square on July 16. It follows the festival's hugely popular Market Dances which opens the festival on July 15, marking the event's fifth year at FODAR.

After a decade of advancing with new works and new ideas, it's appropriate that FODAR steps into its next 10 years with a focus on Street Dance - a culture and movement that has grown in popularity and scope over the past decade. A definite first for the region, the Battle will pit some of Montreal and Toronto's best Street dancers with some of the top Street dancers from Halifax.

In addition to the Battle, the festival will be spotlighting two leading international hip hop artists on its MainStage at King's Theatre - Caroline 'Lady C' Fraser (Toronto) and hip hop legend Crazy Smooth (Ottawa). Both will present major works on July 17 and 19 during PROGRAM ONE. Lady C will be performing her multi Dora award-winning piece CYMATIX. The awards recognize her artistry in the fields of performance and choreography. Smooth, will be showcasing his newest work We Draw the Line, which will premiere at FODAR 2025. The performance will be danced by members of the 10 Gates Dancing company where Smooth is chief choreographer and Artistic Director. 10 Gates was awarded this season's FODAR Creative Residency which runs for two weeks and culminates with a festival performance.

Brief encounters grow new partnerships

FODAR's yearly Creative Residency is a rare chance for artists to explore new directions and to create the beginnings of a new work. These opportunities are rare, and sometimes the work explored has grown from dance artists meeting and getting to know each other while at the festival. PROGRAM TWO presents two artists whose paths crossed at last year's FODAR performing a new duet. Other dancers who were part of FODAR 2024 have returned this year to perform in the revival of Randy Glynn's critically acclaimed Modern Dance classic After Godot, also part of PROGRAM TWO.







Did you know- after shampooing/ towel dry to get excess water out/ then put conditioner on/ leave on for a bit/ rinse off with warm finish with cool. Locks in conditioner/ great for color treated hair too. Applies to leave-in conditioner too. Think of a full glass of water/ no room for anything else/ water out/conditioner in.

Fine hair folks don't always like conditioner-for these folks, we suggest they do not start in the front/you have the most on your hands and it can weigh down the fine hair. Try going to the back/ rub conditioner between the hands/and putting it on there first. Usually, the hair needs it more on the back top layer, again to cool down the water to lock in the conditioner, calm down any flyaways.


