Getting to Know: Artist Geoff Butler

Granville Ferry artist, Geoff Butler, announces the publication of his new book, [We, the Ancestors: stories, paintings and songs from a heritage village.](#)

The setting in this book is a heritage village where, during each tourist season, people live and dress in historical costumes. They work using traditional tools and interact in their daily lives as they would have done in times past.

They are, in costume form at least, our ancestors.

Now we, the living, will in due time be ancestors ourselves. In a similar format to Geoffrey Chaucer's *The Canterbury Tales* (written about 1385-1400), which is a collection of stories told by a group of pilgrims on a journey to the shrine of archbishop Thomas à Becket in Canterbury, this book depicts a group of people getting together to act as ancestors, specifically assuming the roles of characters in a heritage village from an earlier century. As a means to build team spirit, but also to entertain visitors, one of the characters, "the mayor", decides that each character will tell a story. It could be loosely related to their heritage roles, but could also be more contemporary in nature.

In *The Canterbury Tales*, the reward for telling the best story is a free meal provided by the innkeeper. In this book, one of the characters, an artist, offers to reward the other characters with a painting and write a poem or song, loosely connected to the character or the story that was told.





Dear First Responders, Firefighters, NS Dept. Emergency Management, NS Dept. of Natural Resources, RCMP, EHS, Nova Scotia Guard, Canadian Armed Forces, and Volunteers:

As we reach the five-week mark of the West Dalhousie wildfire response, we are filled with deep appreciation for the extraordinary dedication, strength, and resilience each of you has shown throughout this crisis.

Thanks to your tireless efforts, the evacuation order has now been officially lifted, and a phased re-entry will begin on Saturday, September 20th. This marks a major turning point for our community; one made possible only by your unwavering commitment and relentless hard work under extreme conditions.

You have been there every step of the way:

- On the fire lines, containing and managing an unpredictable and dangerous wildfire.
- Assisting with evacuations and protecting our residents with efficiency and compassion.

We know the emotional toll this event has taken, not just on those who lost homes or were displaced, but also on those of you who gave everything - physically, mentally, and emotionally






