Veterans Unmasked

“Masking” is when we hide how we really feel. Work in customer service and you’ll quickly become familiar with presenting an outward cheerful self even when you’re tired, stressed, or struggling. We all mask in some way, but veterans experience masking in a unique context.

Since 2019, veterans in the valley have been participating in a special 7Arts art therapy program called Life Through A Mask. The program was developed locally by Sarah Osborne-Lepage and Amber Juby, both artists and military spouses, to support positive mental health for military members, veterans, and their families. Life Through A Mask offers a safe outlet for individuals affected by service-related stress and trauma, turning their experiences into a piece of art that helps unmask what can’t otherwise be said.

2025 marks the first time veterans and their families bravely share their unmasked stories with the public. Viewing the masks and reading their associated stories is a powerful experience that provides a positive pathway to talk about stress, trauma, and mental health. Each artwork contains a message of resilience and recovery.

Masks are on display at the Macdonald Museum in Middleton. An opening reception will be held on November 1 from 2:00 - 3:30. The exhibit continues weekdays from November 3-14 (10 am - 4 pm), including Remembrance Day, alongside the museum’s community-made exhibit of 2,000+ handmade poppies, and the permanent West Nova Regiment collection. Additional veteran-made artwork will be on display. Admittance is free.

Thank you to all past Life Through A Mask facilitators, especially Jaime Lee Lightle and James Lightle, for making such a meaningful impact on our local veteran community.

What are Greenhouse Gases & Why Do They Matter?

Clean Annapolis River Project (CARP) When we talk about climate change, we're really talking about greenhouse gases. These are gases like carbon dioxide, methane, and water vapor that trap heat in our atmosphere.

Here's how it works:

- Sunlight passes through the atmosphere and warms the Earth.
- The Earth gives off this energy as heat (infrared radiation).
- Greenhouse gases absorb some of that heat, keeping it from escaping back into space.

This "greenhouse effect" is natural—and without it, Earth would be a frozen world, too cold for us to live on.

The problem? Human activities—like burning coal, oil, and gas, cutting down forests, and raising livestock—have added far more greenhouse gases than the Earth can balance. This has made the greenhouse effect stronger, leading to global warming and changes in weather, water cycles, and ecosystems.

Where do extra greenhouse gases come from?

- Electricity & heat production (34%) – burning coal, gas, and oil.
- Industry (24%) – factories, cement, chemicals, and other processes.
- Agriculture & land use (22%) – livestock, crop production, and deforestation.
- Transportation (15%) – cars, trucks, planes, ships, and trains.

At CARP, we're tackling this challenge through our Living Labs project. We monitor greenhouse gas emissions on local farms while testing new practices that:

- Boost biodiversity
- Improve soil and water health
- Reduce harmful emissions

The goal? Farming that works with nature, not against it—helping both people and the planet.

Every choice matters, from the energy we use to the food we grow. By learning where greenhouse gases come from and how they affect us, we can all be part of the solution. (www.annapolisriver.ca)


