Nova Scotia Dykeland System Upgrades Project

The province is making significant investments to strengthen the resilience of the dykeland system to help protect against damage caused by rising sea levels and storm surge events.

In 2019, an eight-year, almost \$50 million project began to upgrade some of the most vulnerable sites in the province. Without upgrades, the sites are at high risk of damage from the impacts of climate change. The dykeland upgrades will improve more than 25 per cent of Nova Scotia's 241 kms of dykeland along the Bay of Fundy. These 16 sites provide flood protection to tens of thousands of residents and businesses, vineyards, historical and world heritage sites, Mi'kmaq communities and more than 20,000 hectares of agricultural land.

The sites being upgraded include 60 kilometres of dykeland and 5 aboiteaux in 4 dykeland systems: Cumberland Basin, Cobequid Bay, Southern Bight and the Annapolis River. Sites were selected based on damage caused by climate change, the dykes' vulnerability to breaching and the communities, agricultural land and infrastructure that the dykeland protects. The upgrades are funded equally by the provincial and federal government

through the Disaster Mitigation and

Adaptation Fund.



Nova Scotia Loyal Supports Local Authors, Publishers, Booksellers

Just in time for the holidays, the Province is making it easier to discover books written or published by Nova Scotians. Starting Friday, October 24, Nova Scotians can receive \$10 off one of 1,600 titles at 11 participating bookstores.

"Nova Scotia is renowned for our storytellers," said Damian Stoilov, Ministerial Assistant for Growth and Development, on behalf of Minister Colton LeBlanc. "Our book industry plays a vital role in sharing our stories and connecting us to each other. Independent bookstores are important cornerstones in our communities that are first to support our local storytellers. Through this new pilot, we are helping more Nova Scotians discover a new favourite local author at a store owned and operated by their neighbours."

The Nova Scotia Loyal book industry pilot program will run through February 28, 2026. A total of 4,000 vouchers worth \$10 will be available through participating bookstores to be applied to the purchase of an eligible Nova Scotian book.

Historic Gardens, located on Alain River marsh in the Town of Annapolis Royal, was one of the 16 sites chosen as part of DSUP. This is great news for Historic Gardens and the tens of thousands of visitors who travel to Annapolis Royal annually to visit the Gardens. Historic Gardens is a premiere provincial attraction showcasing gardening methods, designs and materials representing more than 400 years of local history. https://historicgardens.wordpress.com/

The province has been working with Historic Gardens over the last four years through the design phases and will begin construction around mid-to late October. Construction will take approximately one month to complete. Many of the people working on the construction project are from local communities within Annapolis County.

In addition to the Alain River site, two areas along the Granville side will see work. The Queen Anne Marsh is located along the Annapolis River and borders the communities of Granville, Port Royal and the historic Melanson Settlement. The Dentiballis Marsh is in the community of Granville Beach, just west of the North Hills Museum and east of Stoney Beach Cemetery. Combined, the Dentiballis and Queen Anne marshes contain 814 acres (329 ha) of dyked marshland.

Delaps Cove Trail an 'Amazing Place'

Delaps Cove Wilderness Trail is now known as an amazing place. Anyone who hiked down its trails over the past four decades already knew that, but now the UNESCO Southwest Nova Biosphere Region has made it official, with the United Nations organization making its very first Amazing Places designation.

Mapannapolis was there at the trailhead when the designation was made, and the sign was unveiled October 5, 2025.

"The amazing places program recognizes public locations of special significance that are recognized for their beauty, unique natural features, biodiversity, or cultural and historical aspects," said Debra Ryan, Director of Community Development for Annapolis County.

"Our site has many of these attributes," she said. "Located along the Bay of Fundy shore, the trails meander through forested ecosystems and then emerge along the coastal shoreline of the famous Bay of Fundy. The trail system includes two trails, Bohaker Trail and Charlie's Trail."

"The Municipality of the County of Annapolis is grateful for this recognition and support, and we thank you for that designation," said county Warden Diane LeBlanc. "Our county is proud of our parks systems and the important role they provide to residents and visitors. Together with our partners, we will continue to develop, promote, and protect park opportunities in our communities."

"The region of Annapolis County has been a longtime leader in establishing protected areas and also developing recreational facilities," said Cliff Drysdale, vice chair of the Southwest Nova Biosphere Region Association. "This is a first example of Amazing Places, but hopefully it will not be the last, and hopefully we can promote our concept of the Southwest Nova Biosphere Reserve, not only in Canada, but globally."

Duston Stevenson, councilor with the Delaps Cove Black Indian Pioneer Society, spoke about the history of Delaps Cove as a community where his ancestors lived, noting work he's done with Annapolis County over the past decade, giving guidance on historical and cultural issues. Stevenson also explained the smudging ceremony, the grasses and woods used, and the meaning of directions facing, time of year, and effects of the wafting smoke. Erica Phillips initiated the smudging ceremony.

Mapannapolis tells stories using maps and text, joining the present with the past and creating an understanding of where we came from. Delaps Cove combines elements of nature and humankind in a unique way – beauty, ruggedness, and resilience in one Amazing Place.
