Province Resuming Mail Service Through Canada Post

The Province is resuming mail delivery through Canada Post after postal workers moved to rotating strikes earlier this month. Starting Friday, October 31, Access Nova Scotia centres will no longer be used as drop-off and pickup locations for essential provincial government correspondence.

Though mail delivery has restarted, people can still expect delays. To help avoid delays, people are encouraged to use online services when available. Many programs and services offer several ways to correspond with the government and complete a service or transaction.

Program and service information on the government website and on government forms and applications will say if people can complete the service or transaction online, by email or in person.

Did You Know?

In 1840, Samuel Cunard, a war veteran and timber merchant from Halifax, Nova Scotia, established the Cunard line. His ships were steam powered ferries - the first in the area - and over the next few years Cunard branched out to ocean steam, providing a mail service to Prince Edward Island, along the coast and, later, across the Atlantic. Cows were kept on board for fresh milk every day and were slaughtered to be eaten on the final day of each voyage. During the 1840s, Charles Dickens sailed with Cunard to Boston, and the first Cunard Transatlantic Crossing took place when Britannia set sail in July 1840. Today, Cunard Lines operates only 4 ships, but they are iconic: Queen Anne, Queen Elizabeth, Queen Victoria and Queen Mary 2. Samual Cunard's statue is on the Halifax waterfront. 





When Wigney moved to her century home in 2010, she was met with a landscape dominated by non-pative traces and plants, remports of


2010, she was met with a landscape dominated by non-native trees and plants, remnants of centuries of colonial cultivation. What began as curiosity became a long-term act of reclamation. Over the years, she has reintroduced native species to rebuild an ecosystem capable of sustaining birds, mammals, and insects. The exhibition reveals this transformation through a blend of photography, watercolour illustration, field sketches, and video, offering viewers an intimate portrait of nature's resilience when given space to heal.


Her camera traps have captured the return of foxes, bobcats, deer, bears, and countless smaller creatures, confirming the success of her rewilding efforts. Through her lens and brush, she documents the gradual reawakening of biodiversity, inviting others to imagine what is possible when we act as caretakers rather than consumers of the natural world.

"As a lifelong naturalist, Wigney combines art and science to record the complex life unfolding on her land," said Sophie Paskins, ARTSPLACE Gallery Director.

Bev Wigney's photographs have appeared in numerous field guides, books, and museum exhibits. She is the founder and administrator of the "Annapolis Environment & Ecology" group on Facebook, where she continues to share her studies of local flora and fauna.

For over thirty years, Sweet has painted the rhythms of rural Nova Scotia, where she lives and works in Hants County. Her fascination with cattle-observed along winding country roads and across rolling fields—anchors her latest series of acrylic paintings. In 2024, she expanded her fieldwork to include visits to small agricultural fairs throughout the region, gathering visual material and inspiration that would shape her winter studio practice. 
