Province Supports West Dalhousie Hall

A generator purchased to support the Long Lake wildfires response this summer will remain in West Dalhousie, Annapolis County, to help residents be prepared for future emergencies.

The Department of Emergency Management has donated the generator that was brought in to support the wildfire incident command centre, located in the West Dalhousie Community Hall during most of the firefighting effort.

"The resiliency of Annapolis County and its residents is a true testament to the Bluenoser spirit, and I am so proud at how the community has come together to heal from this summer's wildfire," said **Emergency Management Minister Kim** Masland, who announced the donation at the hall today, November 19. "We know recovering from an emergency takes time, and we continue to support these efforts."

The generator will remain at the hall, which also served as a comfort centre during the wildfire, to support the future needs of the community and emergency response.

Getting to Know: Randy's Wood Products

Randy's Wood Products has become a familiar stop for people working on homes and community spaces throughout the region. What began as a small one-person woodworking shop has grown into a place where people come not only for materials, but also for practical help, shared experience, and a connection to the work they're doing.

The shop focuses on interior woodwork and the materials that shape the inside of a home—trim, baseboards, crown moulding, wainscoting, casings, and interior doors. These are the details that often go unnoticed once a room is complete, yet they help define its character. Many customers come in looking to replace a single piece, match something from an older home, or gather supplies for a renovation or new build. Others arrive with personal projects or new ideas and simply need a place to begin.

Much of the hands-on work happens in the workshop, where custom items such as butcher block countertops, cabinet doors, kitchen islands, and tables are made. Some days involve shaping trim to match a historic profile; other days are spent building pieces to fit a specific size or style. Each project has its own story, and the team appreciates being part of that process.

The shop also carries Dulux paints, primers, and stains, which many customers find helpful when planning their finishing work. Having materials and finishes in the same place often makes it easier for people to see how everything fits together.

The team—Randy, Chris, Will, and Kerry—works with a wide mix of folks. Homeowners stop in with boards to compare, designers come with room layouts, and contractors pick up materials for a jobsite. Conversations often turn into problemsolving sessions, and many visitors leave with clearer direction than when they arrived. Over time, Randy's Wood Products has become a place where good work, local knowledge, and community connections meet.

As a local business, the shop plays a steady role in the region's building and renovation life. It supports small contractors and tradespeople and helps keep projects moving forward. Careful use of materials and an interest in reducing waste are part of the everyday approach in the workshop.

For those who have never visited, the shop is located at 924 Mary Jane Riley Road in rural Bear River. There is plenty of parking, and the doors are open Monday to Friday, 8:00am to 4:30pm. The workshop is on the ground floor, and the paint, building materials, and office are up a flight of stairs. For anyone with mobility concerns, the team is always happy to help on the ground floor and bring materials out to your vehicle.
